Michael Barkin is currently Minister Counselor for Consular Affairs at the U.S. Embassy in Ottawa, Canada, where he oversees U.S. consular operation in the Embassy and the six U.S. consulates in Canada. Previously, he served as Deputy Chief of Mission at the U.S. Embassy in San Salvador and as Deputy Director of the Office of Canadian Affairs in the Bureau of Western Hemisphere Affairs. A career member of the Foreign Service, he served from 2009-2012 as Principal Officer and Consul General in Matamoros, Mexico. Prior to that assignment, Mr. Barkin served as Deputy Principal Officer and head of consular services in Amsterdam, the Netherlands.

Previous postings include consul in the U.S. Embassy in Sofia, Bulgaria and work in the Office of Multilateral Affairs in the State Department's Bureau of Democracy, Human Rights and Labor (DRL). He began his Foreign Service career with consular and political tours in Honduras and Uruguay.

He is a lawyer by training and worked as a state prosecutor and public defender prior to joining the Foreign Service in 1995. Originally from Florida, he is a graduate of Emory University in Atlanta (Bachelor of Arts in Literature and Philosophy), New York University (Juris Doctor), and Princeton University (Master in Public Policy).
