Description: The fourth PFR was received on 17 February 2015 and was updated from time to time with the last update received on 8 February 2016. The government requested a loan of \$50 million from ADB's ordinary capital resources (OCR) to finance completion of works for subprojects financed under tranches 1 and 2. Additional financing for these subprojects is required because of: (i) the application of the price escalation clause in the contracts, which results in a funding gap; and (ii) adjustment in quantities of bill-of-quantities items based on site conditions.

Status: ADB Board approved on March 18, 2016.

Description: The proposed rehabilitation project includes 212 km of damaged highway sections and 33 damaged bridges located on the national highway network of Pakistan. It will restore critical physical infrastructure to sustain livelihoods and access to markets, as well as build post disaster traffic management capacity in the National Highway Authority (NHA). The project will contribute to the economic recovery of 2010 flood affected areas in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Punjab, and Sindh provinces.

Business Opportunities

- Consulting Services: All consultants will be recruited according to ADB's Guidelines on the Use of Consultants. A consulting firm will be recruited to provide construction supervision through the quality- and cost-based selection (QCBS) method based on 90:10 ratio. Individual consultants will be recruited to provide implementation support to the EA in various areas including procurement, contract administration, resettlement and social safeguards and financial management etc. One international individual consultant will be engaged to augment NHA's post-disaster traffic management capacity.
- Procurement of goods, works, and services will follow ADB's Procurement Guidelines (2015, as amended from time to time) and Guidelines on the Use of Consultants (2013, as amended from time to time). The contracts were packaged based on an assessment of the site area in view of the construction season and geographical location. In this procurement plan, of the 17 civil works packages, six contracts in two packages will be procured through international competitive bidding and 11 contracts through five packages will be procured through national competitive bidding.

Description: The Project will secure raw water supply to the 13 million inhabitants of Metropolitan Waterworks and Sewerage System (MWSS) service area, through the rehabilitation of the Angat transmission line. It is estimated that currently each day about 800,000 cubic meter (m³) or 20% of the total potential capacity of raw water is lost due to leakage of the aqueducts. The main components of the Angat transmission line are as old as 50 years, in poor condition, and not in compliance with structural and seismic requirements, risking the partial interruption of Metro Manila's water supply.

Description: The Bangladesh Power System Enhancement and Efficiency Improvement Project (the Project) to be prepared using the TA will enhance the coverage and improve the reliability and efficiency of the transmission and distribution network. This will facilitate better utilization of the country's growing power generation capacity to meet the growth in electricity demand across the country. It takes forward support to the transmission and distribution utilities provided under the Power System Expansion and Efficiency Improvement Investment Program, a multi-tranche financing facility (MFF) approved in 2012 of which the final tranche was approved in 2015.

The Government of Bangladesh has requested ADB lending assistance of about \$400 million in 2016 to finance the government's investment plan for transmission and distribution to be taken up by the Power Grid Company of Bangladesh Limited (PGCB), the Bangladesh Rural Electrification Board (BREB), the Dhaka Power Distribution Company Limited (DPDC), and the Dhaka Electric Supply Company Limited (DESCO). The project is expected to be approved in 2016.

Outcome: A well-designed Bangladesh Power System Enhancement and Efficiency Improvement Project developed

Outputs: Technical and sector due diligence reviews of components of the ensuing project undertaken

Description: The small-scale project preparatory technical assistance (S-PPTA) is not included in the 2016 pipeline of ADB's India country operations business plan (COBP), 2016-2018. The formal inclusion of the intended loan program will be confirmed with the Government of India in 2016. The S-PPTA will jumpstart due diligence and preparatory work for a loan or series of loans to fund the pipeline. Consultation missions fielded on 10-11 December 2015 and 11-14 January 2016 to discuss project preparation activities and obtain additional information, underscored the need to begin due diligence and preparatory work.

Business Opportunities

- **Consulting Services:** Four international consultants for 8.5 person-months and one national consultant for 2 person-months will be recruited. ADB will engage the consultants on an individual basis in accordance with its Guidelines on the Use of Consultants (2013, as amended from time to time), and other arrangements satisfactory to ADB for engaging individual consultants. Disbursements under the S-PPTA will be made in accordance with ADB's Technical Assistance Disbursement Handbook (2010, as amended from time to time). The consultants will prepare inception, draft final reports. Lump-sum payments/output-based contracts will be considered for consulting services under the TA.

Description: The Asian Development Bank (ADB) will provide a loan to Energy Efficiency Services Limited (EESL), to be guaranteed by the Government of India, to support demand-side energy efficiency investments in several Indian states. EESL was set up as a government-owned energy services company (ESCO) to facilitate energy efficiency investments, including work designing, implementing, monitoring and investing in energy efficiency projects. ADB's loan will cover high-priority areas under EESL's ESCO business namely through use of: (i) more efficient light-emitting diode (LED) municipal

street lighting equipped with remote operating technology; (ii) more efficient domestic lighting through replacement of incandescent lights with LEDs; and (iii) more energy efficient agricultural water pumps. EESL estimates that energy savings of 80% can be achieved in the domestic lighting programs and 30% can be achieved with more efficient pumps. Savings will result in lower electricity bills for consumers, peak power shaving, and reduced commercial losses for distribution companies. The project will also demonstrate the potential for energy efficiency achievements and scalability of the ESCO model for realizing energy savings in India.

Business Opportunities

- Consulting Services: Phase 1 of the TA will require 16 person-months of international consulting and 18 person-months of national consultants, and the gender and financial specialists will also provide support during the subproject preparation. Phase 2 of the TA will also require 62 person-months of national consulting services. ADB will hire individual consultants for project preparatory work and a firm to support project implementation, to implement the communication strategy and to evaluate new business opportunities. All hiring will be done in accordance with the Guidelines on the Use of Consultants (2013, as amended from time to time). For recruiting a firm, quality- and cost-based consultant selection method will be used. Lump-sum payments and output-based contracts will be considered for consulting services under the TA.

Description: The \$500 million sector loan aims to help improve access to electricity services in Eastern Indonesia (Kalimantan, Maluku, Nusa Tenggara, Papua, and Sulawesi) by supporting a cluster of new small- to mid-sized power stations fueled by natural gas which is a clean burning fuel that has lower power generation costs and less local pollutants and carbon dioxide (CO₂) emissions compared to diesel-fired units. The project also plans to include pilot-scale gas and solar hybrid units that can help enhance the borrower's operational know-how and position them well for future scale up of renewable energy use.

Business Opportunities

- Consulting Services: The implementation of the project preparatory technical assistance (PPTA) will require the services of a multidisciplinary team comprising international and national consultants. Approximately fourteen consultants (8 international and 6 national) for 55 person-months (PM) of consulting services (28 international and 27 of national) will be engaged through an international firm in accordance with the ADB's Guidelines on the Use of Consultants (2013, as amended from time to time) following Quality- and Cost-Based Selection (QCBS) (90:10). Description: The types of gender gaps, and the most relevant entry points for gender mainstreaming in each ADB investment are unique in each DMC. This is reflected in the wide range of (2013) Gender Inequality Index scores in the region (a score of 0 indicates gender parity) ranging from 0.323 in Kazakhstan to 0.705 in Afghanistan. As such, resources are required for ADB's analysis, women's participation, formulation of country and sector-specific approaches and capacity assistance to government implementation in the thematic area of gender to ensure inclusive growth. The TA will provide consultants covering each ADB resident mission in the region to inform the portfolio from a social and gender perspective, assist with identification of entry points for effective gender mainstreaming, assist sector specialists with the development and implementation of investment projects and programs, and participate on behalf of ADB with relevant country level networks for gender and social inclusion.

Specifically, the S-PATA will contribute in implementing food safety measures in the country. It will support key provisions of the CAREC Transport and Trade Facilitation Strategy 2020 and the CAREC Trade Policy Strategic Action Plan. Description: ADB is proposing to provide a direct loan facility of up to \$175 million to a portfolio of special purpose vehicles (SPVs) owned by Mytrah Energy (India) Ltd. (MEIL). ADB's facility will be structured such that a separate loan will be provided to each project SPV on a project finance (limited recourse) basis. The Transaction being financed comprises 476MW of wind projects in four SPVs in Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Andhra Pradesh and Karnataka and 100MW of solar projects in two SPVs in Telangana and Punjab. The six SPVs are:
